September is **Blood Cancer Awareness Month**

Blood cancers are cancers of the blood, bone marrow or lymph nodes that affect normal blood cell production or function.

Leukemia, lymphoma, and multiple myeloma are the most common blood cancers.

Common Symptoms:

- Fatigue
- Feeling weak or breathless
- Fever or night sweats
- Significant bruising or bleeding
- Pain in bones or joints



Common Psychosocial Issues:

- Fear of recurrence
- Grief
- Depression
- Body image
- Survivor guilt



Common Financial Issues:

- Denial of insurance coverage
- Difficulty finding jobs
- Lost wages and insurance benefits
- Rising medical costs
